Hand, Foot, & Mouth Disease Letter to Parents

Parent/Guardian:

Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease is a viral infection caused by a strain of the Coxsackie virus. It causes a blisterlike rash that, as the name implies, involves the hands, feet, and mouth.

This infection usually occurs in children under 10 years of age, but can occasionally occur in young adults.

The virus is spread by direct contact with nose and throat discharges, fluid from blisters on the hands and feet, and feces of the infected person.

Initial symptoms of Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease include

low-grade fever, poor appetite, runny nose, and sore throat and usually appear 3 to 5 days after exposure to the virus. The classic rash symptoms (blisters in the mouth, on the feet, and the front and back of the hands) appear 1 to 2 days after the initial symptoms. A child is contagious when the first symptoms appear and may continue to be contagious until the blister-like skin lesions disappear. The virus can be shed in the stool for up to several weeks.

This illness is typically mild and complications are rare. After diagnosis by your physician, treatment usually consists of fever control and adequate fluids.

If you suspect that your child has Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease, contact your physician. If your child attends daycare please make you child's caretaker aware as well.

Strep Throat Letter to Parents

Dear Parents/Guardians:

As we enter the winter season, please watch for signs of Strep Throat. Information concerning the signs and symptoms of Strep and methods of treatment are listed below.

If you suspect that your child is experiencing the symptoms of Strep Throat please contact your physician so that a diagnosis can be made.

Signs and Symptoms

If your child has strep throat, he or she will likely have throat pain and difficulty swallowing. But this isn't always the case. In fact, it's possible to have a strep throat infection without a sore throat. In general, however, signs and symptoms of strep throat include:

Red and swollen tonsils, Tonsils are specialized lymph nodes located on either side of your throat, just behind and above your tongue. Sometimes you may see white streaks or patches of pus on the tonsils. Your child's tonsils also may have a gray or white coating.

- Swollen, tender lymph glands on the side of your child's neck.
- Fever.
- Headache.
- Muscle aches.
- Stomach ache and possibly vomiting, especially in smaller children.

Your child may have many of these signs and symptoms but not have strep throat. In fact, these symptoms could be signs of a sore throat caused by a virus, tonsillitis or other illnesses. That's why your doctor may test your child specifically for strep throat.

Sometimes symptoms can occur even after your child has finished treatment for strep throat. Call your doctor if your child develops a fever — or has pain or swelling in the joints, shortness of breath or a rash — 1 to 6 weeks after a strep infection. These may be signs of rheumatic fever.

Treatment

If your child has strep throat, your pediatrician will likely prescribe an oral antibiotic. Once treatment begins, you can expect your child to start feeling better in just a day or two. But make sure your child finishes the entire course of medicine. If your child feels well enough, he or she will be able to return to school or day-care after being treated with an antibiotic for 24 hours.

Remember your child must be fever free and no vomiting for 24 hours prior to returning to school.

HEAD LICE INFO

What head lice are

Head lice are tiny insects that feed solely on the blood of people, and are most common on children of early elementary school age. Head lice grasp the head hair with their claws and insert their tiny mouthparts into the skin for just a minute or so to drink a tiny droplet of blood. Lice cannot burrow into the skin and do not play a role in transmitting any disease-causing organisms. Thus, head lice are rarely anything more than a nuisance. These insect pests are most commonly shared by direct head-to-head contact. Activities such as hugging, play wrestling, and sharing a bed all offer opportunities for lice to spread between friends and family members. Regardless of the wealth of the community or family, the cleanliness of the home, or the month of the year, however, ---only about one in every 100 U.S. elementary school children will be infested with head lice, of those infested children, only a few will spread" lice to others.

How to manage and prevent head lice at school

Head lice infest people, *not* school buildings or buses. A louse that falls from the hair will very likely die within hours, and almost certainly die by the next day. Thus, applying insecticides in the school or bus to control or prevent head lice is unnecessary and wasteful. It may also be prohibited by law. If a child does have lice, only the child's parent or guardian should or need be notified—ideally at the end of the day. The parent should be offered scientifically and medically sound information on how to manage the problem. Divulging the child's medical condition to the teacher or principal, or to other students and their parents, would violate confidentiality. **Head lice may be an annoyance, but they are neither a serious medical problem nor a public health issue.** The school's efforts regarding lice is to educate students, parents, and school personnel with up-to-date information. **Unjustified actions include screening children for lice or nits, treating children at school, treating the school building, and excluding from school children who are infested or presumably infested.**

Much ado about nits

Lice eggs seem to cause more panic among parents and school staff than does nearly any other problem associated with head lice. Dead eggs and the remnants of hatched eggs remain firmly glued onto the hair for weeks, months, or even years. If nits are discovered, look for a live (crawling) louse. If none is found, then the logical conclusion is that the child is likely no longer infested. Check again occasionally, but do not treat unless a live louse is found. The vast majority of objects presumed to be nits are simply bits of debris. But because bits of debris are frequently misidentified as lice eggs, many children are misdiagnosed, sent home, and treated unnecessarily.

Head lice are acquired mainly by *direct head-to-head contact* with an infested person. Inanimate objects (such as combs, brushes, hair accessories and other such items) serve little, if any role in the transmission of head lice. Louse combs used to remove lice should be rinsed in hot water and wiped clean with a towel or a small brush. Generally, hot water from the water faucet will be sufficient to kill lice and their eggs with just a few seconds of exposure. If the water it too hot for washing hands, it is likely adequate to kill lice and eggs quickly on combs. Boiling the water is excessive for this purpose, and risks causing burns and damaging some combs. Shared helmets and headphones in schools or recreational settings would rarely, if ever, harbor an occasional head louse or nit. The effort necessary to effectively inspect and clean these devices, however, is not warranted. Shared lockers or coat hooks pose even less risk as sources of contamination.

What parents can do to eliminate and prevent head lice

Before considering any kind of treatment, find a live (crawling) insect and make sure it is a louse. If lice are found on one family member, then all other children and adults in the home should be checked as well. If the hair is fairly fine and not tangled, then a lice or nit comb can be useful in detecting and removing these insects and their eggs. Some, but not all, infestations can be eliminated by this method. If combing is difficult, impractical, or has been unsuccessful, then pediculicides can prove valuable. Pediculicides are special insecticide products registered by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to treat lice. Most over-the-counter (OTC) pediculicides contain pyrethrins (extracts of chrysanthemum flowers) or their synthetic equivalent. Used as directed on the package, these products can be effective at killing lice. A repeat treatment, about 10 days after the first, is often needed.

2025 Graduates Post-Secondary Up-date

- 1. All Seniors should have submitted or are finishing up their college applications at this time. If you need further assistance with this process please contact the counselor's office.
- 2. Seniors should collect recommendations from teachers & community members for scholarship applications by mid January.
- 3. Since housing will be limited at most colleges, seniors should notify colleges in January and state their plans. Students should then make a housing deposit in about four to six weeks.
- 4. Seniors planning to enter the workforce immediately after high school should be completing resumes & researching jobs.
- 5. Many colleges will allow seniors to take the ACT & SAT on campus, with the understanding that the ACT & SAT scores are only valid at that school. Seniors may want to take advantage of this opportunity to raise scores so they are eligible for admission or scholarships at that college.
- 6. Parents are encouraged to call the counselor's office if they have any questions concerning their student's post-secondary plans. (phone 309-582-2223 Ext.1)

Juniors Research Post-Secondary Plans

During the month of January juniors should discuss and research postsecondary options with their parents. Parents are asked to help students narrow the post-secondary selection to three by August of 2025. Please note the following suggestions to help with the post secondary search.

- 1. Take a career inventory on-line.
- 2. Research post-secondary schools on-line for chosen career fields.
- 3. Arrange post-secondary visits with schools of interest.
- 4. Compile a list of local scholarships & collect applications to review scholarship criteria.
- 5. Take the ACT in April (at MCHS).
- 6. Meet with college representatives in February, March, & April as they visit MCHS.
