SCHOOL NEWS UPDATE 4. Natalie Nelson, $6^{\text {th }}$ Grade Special Education Teacher, shared a video with the board explaining "Genius Hour" during her English class. One student's passion came to life during this time when he chose to run an animal shelter drive. Posters were hung up around the school. 226 items were collected and donated to the local animal shelter. The Mercer County Animal Control Officer also visited Mrs. Nelson's classroom and spoke to her students.
5. Tab Balmer commented that Ginny Boultinghouse was very appreciative of the plaque presented to her for 39 years of driving school bus for the kids of Mercer County.
6. Mike Bowns went over the minutes of the Finance Committee touching base on the increase of the Health Insurance Account and stating that the General State Aid is coming in on time.

Bill Smock discussed the presentation by Bray Architects that was held prior to the Board Meeting. He mentioned the process involving the community and a survey that would be sent out. Don Yates reminded the board and the principals about the opportunities Brad Long was offering with donation of time on small projects.

Julie Wagner reviewed the minutes from the Policy Committee stating no changes were recommended.

Tab Balmer went over the minutes of the Transportation Committee, touching base on the bus barn options. The district will seek bids for a nonheated 8-12 bus building to be built in Joy. Mr. Petrie discussed the Johannes Contract increasing $4.5 \%$ from last year. He also discussed the recommendation to lease 6 new buses from Midwest Transit and trading four of our buses.
7. A memorandum of understanding between the board and MCEA was discussed, agreeing to the continuance of past practice of paying an extra duty junior high athletic director as well as creating the positions of JH Head Softball Coach and JH Assistant Softball Coach due to the addition of the Junior High Softball Program.

and Midwest Transit Equipment. He discussed the different options requested on a two year lease from both companies. The Transportation Committee recommended accepting the proposal from Midwest Transit to lease six buses for two years and trading in four buses for a total cost of \$157,520.

10. Julie Wagner reminded the board about the March 3rd Black Hawk Division meeting. This meeting will take place at Geneseo High School. Registration begins at $5: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ with dinner to follow at $6: 00 \mathrm{pm}$.
11. Mr. Bush spoke about the ELA curriculum that is being considered for our district. During our Teacher's Institute Day on Feb. $14^{\text {th }}$, the teachers met at the Intermediate Building for an online conference with teachers from another school district to discuss the Amplify Curriculum. Feedback was very positive.
12. Steve Smith, Clean Energy Design Company, spoke to the board regarding renewable energy production from solar installations at Mercer County School District. Sample proposals were included in the board packet.
13. In addition to their written reports, the following was mentioned: Mrs. Day mentioned the Walk of Champions held at the High School for the wrestlers heading to Individual State. Hall of Fame is scheduled for Friday, Feb. $21^{\text {st }}$ during the Boys Basketball Game.

Mr. Bush announced the New Boston Elementary Family Night and Book Fair scheduled for Wed, March $4^{\text {th }}$.

Mr. Fleuette mentioned the resignation of $1^{\text {st }}$ Grade Teacher, Chad Robertson. He's had many applicants for that job position and hopes to have it filled by next month's board meeting.
