OTHER REPORTS AND DISCUSSIONS:

PUBLIC COMMENT

1. Several members of the community addressed the board with concerns about the mask mandate that was put into place by Governor Pritzker on August 4th. Several parents spoke asking the board to go against the mandate stating it's time we take a stand and take back control of our district. Some shared concerns about the mental emotional state of their kids after wearing masks last year and the statistics of teen suicide increasing over that time. Ideas were shared about raising money to cover the funding that could potentially be lost. One parent shared concerns that if we chose to not follow the mandate that our state may go back to stricter guidelines, including the possibility of shutting schools down.

BOARD COMMENTS

2. Julie Wagner addressed the board stating her frustrations with the state especially over the last month. On July 23rd the board approved a draft plan stating masks are optional. On August 4th Governor Pritzker passed a mask mandate for all school districts taking the control out of the hands of the local board. She understands what the state is threatening to take away from our schools and wants to do what is best for our kids. Several other board members expressed concerns about the loss of state funding and loss of the school's ability to engage in any IHSA and IESA athletic competitions. Health and safety concerns of students and staff are top priority.
