SCHOOL CALENDAR	10. The calendar committee provided staff with two calendar options for the 2023-2024 school year. Both options include a week for spring break. Staff approved of Option 1 which balances the length of each semester and provides a full two weeks off at Christmas. We have removed the half day SIP days and Fast Fridays at the High School, while adding a 2PM

dismissal every Wednesday. There is little to no loss in instructional time with these changes.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS
